Op Cracker June 2020 – In conjunction with Police Volunteer coordinator, Antony Baldwin and McCains, a new advice booklet has been produced at short notice in response to covid-19. This provides information on a whole host of issues including social distancing, local contacts and general crime prevention advice. Please let us know of any others who would like some.

We are continuing with four multi-agency meetings per week to combat persistent ASB and assist those most vulnerable people and high risk domestic issues. The meetings are run in conjunction with the Community Impact Team from Scarborough. We currently have 17 live cases that we are dealing with across the area.

Please note that in addition to the traditional 999 or 101 we can be contacted on our email address is snafiley@northyorkshire.pnn.police.uk. Please do not report incidents to this email, but if you would like to speak to a member of our team for advice then please use it.

If an incident of Anti-Social Behaviour occurs which you would like Police to deal with then please report this as soon as possible after the event to allow Officers the best chance to deal with the culprits. Please do not wait until next time you happen to bump into an Officer or Parish Councillor. It allows us to make connections with other incidents and deal with individuals for patterns of behaviour rather than incidents in isolation. It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.

Community Speed watch

A subject we are regularly asked about by Parish/Town Councils is speeding, in particular 'Community Speed Watch'.

In order for the road to be deemed suitable for Community Speed Watch, it needs to be investigated via a speed survey. This is prompted by the use of our Speed Concern forms available on the NYP website (see link below).

Once we receive the form, an investigation is started and data loggers are deployed by NYFRS on the road for 24 hours a day over a seven day period. When we receive this information back, we can then decide on the most appropriate outcome. Those roads with a relatively high speeding problem will be referred to the Safety Camera Team for enforcement, or to Highways to implement an engineering outcome – speed bumps, chicanes, etc. If the road is found to have a relatively low or no speeding problem then it is referred to the relevant department to see if Community Speed Watch would be suitable.

If it is decided the road is suitable, the original complainant or the parish council will be contacted and asked to fill out the paperwork that we require (a minimum of four people are required to sign up to the scheme to start)
