#### January 2023

There were 77 incidents reported in your area during January.

01/01/2023 18:50 – A report was received from Hunmanby Hall that youths were climbing on scaffolding.

02/01/2023 19:51 - A further report of four youths climbing on scaffolding at Hunmanby Hall. A local PCSO attended and has since located all youths involved. Strong words of advice have been given to them all in the presence of their parents.

05/01/2023 09:04 – Half a tank of heating oil was reported to have been stolen between 27/12/22 and 28/12/22 from a property on Filey Road in Flixton.

08/01/2023 22:26 – A driver his a large pot hold on A165 heading out of Reighton towards Bridlington. Officers contacted NYCC Highways to inform them and ensure the road was repaired.

12/01/2023 17:10 – A two vehicle RTC occurred on New Road cross-roads junction with Bartindale Road/Hunmanby Hall Road. Officers attended to manage the scene and assist in vehicle removal. One of the vehicles spilled oil on the brow of the hill so NYCC Highways were contacted to make it safe.

13/01/2023 09:30 – A vehicle was stopped by officers on patrol in Reighton village. The driver of the vehicle was disqualified from driving and also had no insurance. He was further arrested for other matters and charged with the driving offences.

13/01/2023 14:59 – A parent picking their child up from Hunmanby School reports their wing mirror had been knocked off by an unknown vehicle. They state this was the fourth time in the last month that damage had been caused to their wing mirrors.

16/01/2023 16:10 – A vehicle being driven in an erratic manner was stopped by Officers on patrol in Flixton. The driver failed a road side breath test, providing a reading 2 ½ times the legal limit. They were later charged with driving and will appear at court in February.

24/01/2023 15:55 – An two vehicle RTC occurred on A165 just over the Humberside border. The road was closed from the Dotterel roundabout for several hours. Three people were taken to hospital with serious injuries.

29/01/2023 06:34 – An off-duty Officer on their way to work happened upon an RTC on A165 junction with Reighton nurseries. A vehicle had crashed into the roadside barrier and was stuck underneath it. Officers assisted until recovery arrived.

**Change to front office opening times** - Due to staffing difficulties, the front counter hours of both Filey and Eastfield Police Station are changing for the next 9 months. Filey will be open 0900-1500 every Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Eastfield will be open 0900-1500 every Tuesday and Thursday.

During January we dealt with 661 incidents across the area as a whole, a breakdown of these follows (not inclusive of all incidents): -

- 0 animal incidents
- 24 highway disruptions

- 10 sexual offences.
- 16 thefts.

- 3 stolen motor vehicles.
- 9 fraud or forgery.
- 2 drug offence.
- 27 criminal damages.
- 2 dwelling or commercial burglaries.
- 2 auto crimes.
- 55 anti-social behaviour reports.

It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.
