## July 2023

There were 124 incidents reported in your area during July.

Officers have been very busy on the holiday camps during July, many incidents have been reported resulting in numerous arrests. These incidents take up a large proportion of our time but unfortunately cannot be avoided.

03/07/2023 13:52 – A large barrel plastic plant tub valued at £160 was reported to have been stolen from outside Boots Chemist on Bridlington Street. Officers began enquiries but further investigation by Hunmanby in Bloom members revealed it has been taken to be cleaned up and is now present and correct once more. Thank you for updating us before we got too far down the road and arrested any well-meaning members of Hunmanby in Bloom!

05/07/2023 09:43 – An elderly resident received phone calls two days in a row stating his visa card has been hacked into and they had to move £800 from one account to another – he didn't have any money in that account. Despite the residents mature years, he was switched on to the ham fisted attempted scam and hung up the phone. Please pass this message on to any elderly relatives, neighbours, friends etc... its okay to simply put the phone down without speaking to these criminals, if in doubt, put the phone down and call your bank back and explain what has occurred.

14/07/2023 19:42 – An RTC was reported near to The Dotterel. Two vehicles were involved with one ending up on its roof. Officers attended to assist with recovery and managing the scene, all were treated at the scene for shock.

15/07/2023 14:57 – A resident reports having their Facebook account hacked and the hackers attempting to sell concert tickets to her friends. Although there is no monetary loss to the victim, there was a potential for people on her friends list to be scammed. Please report instances such as this to Facebook and remain vigilant when purchasing items from a social media account.

17/07/2023 09:05 – A single vehicle injury RTC was reported near to Reighton reservoir. A member of the public reported a heavily damaged vehicle in a hedge with smoke coming from the engine. The driver was eventually located at Bridlington hospital with minor injuries.

23/07/2023 21:07 – Officers on patrol happen upon two fire engines at a shed fire in a field off Northgate in Hunmanby. An investigation into the incident is ongoing to ascertain the circumstances and whether it was an accident or a criminal act.

During July we dealt with 889 incidents across the area as a whole, a breakdown of these follows (not inclusive of all incidents): -

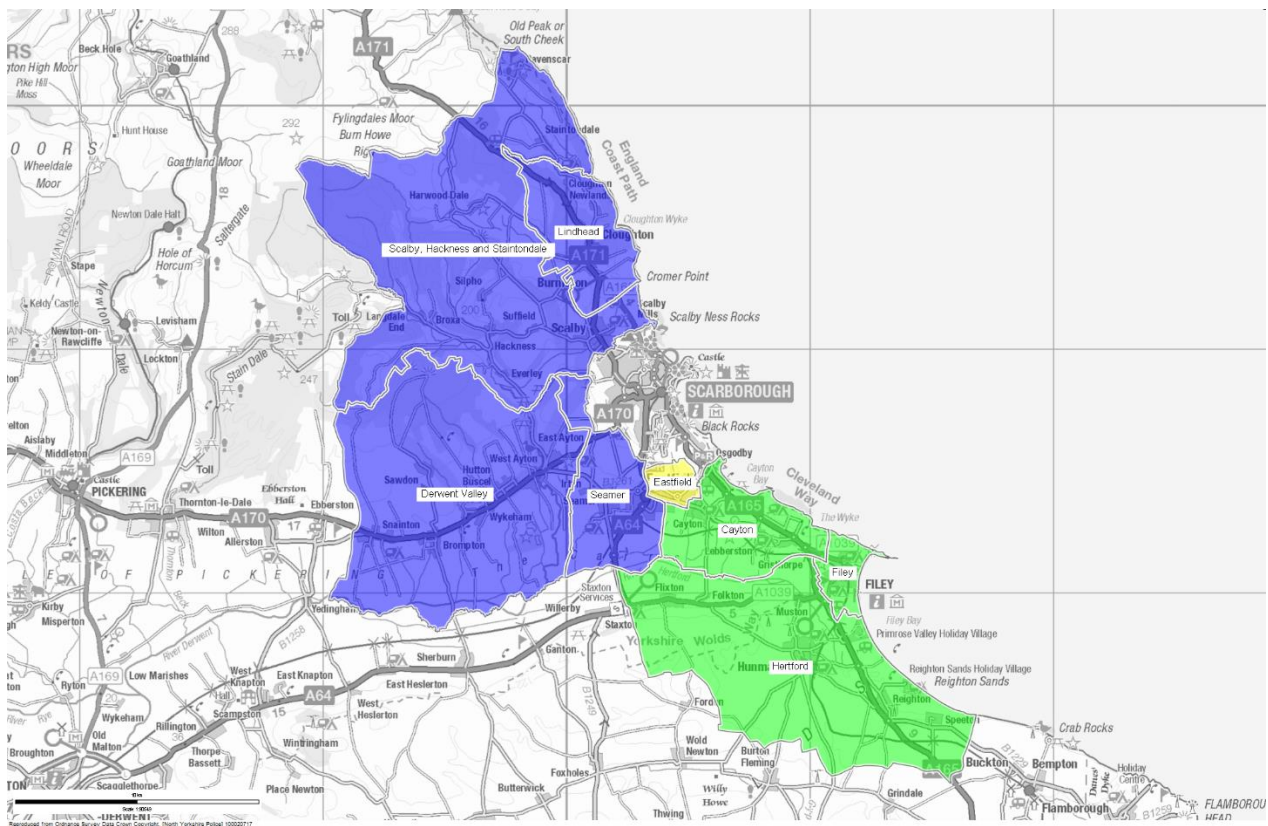

- 0 stolen motor vehicle.
- 13 fraud or forgery.
- 2 drug offence.
- 22 criminal damages.
- 5 dwelling or commercial burglaries.
- 1 auto crimes.

- 60 anti-social behaviour reports.

It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.

# Community Safety Advice – August 2023

## Barbeque Fire Safety

Here we are in August already! Barbeques should be all fired up and everyone enjoying the sunshine 😊 but speaking of barbeques and fires – if you are going to have one outside, ensure you are careful with open fires or naked flames.

When/if the ground is tinder dry, as it can be if we have had little or no rain, fires can start in a second so please be extremely careful with any naked flames; the last thing we need in this area are flash fires, especially if you are out and about in the forestry!

## Bogus Callers and Online Security

It is all too easy at times, especially when distracted, to fall victim of Internet crime. We have all had them, the emails supposedly from firms telling you to download this or that or that one-line email from someone in your mailing list – but how do we know these emails are truly safe?

Firstly, look at the sender address (this is at the top of the email) where it says “from” – do you recognise the sender? If it is supposed to be from your bank, is it your bank email address, ensure it is **exactly** as it should be. If you are unsure, delete the email do NOT click on any links it contains, and contact your bank yourself because bank emails usually have some code word included that a Scammer would not have access to. If it is from a bank, you do not use then do not even open the email, just “bin it”. If the sender is in your normal mailing list, it’s possible they have been hacked – especially if it is worded with “hey, take a look at this! (then a link to a website). In this instance, err on the side of caution and phone your friend to see if they have sent you something; if they haven’t “bin it” without touching the link as it could be linked to a virus to download onto your system!

If it is from a “get rich quick” scheme **always** assume that this is what is called a Scam. Scams have one thing in mind and that is to get as much money out of you as possible before you realise what is happening; sometimes their “targets” do not even realise they are being scammed because they are so good and convincing at it - but once all their money is gone, they the scammers are gone as well and with all your hard-earned savings as well – one victim in recent years was taken for over £60,000 and the scammers will have had no conscience about doing so!

## Bogus Callers

Bogus Callers will call at your home and say “your roof needs repairing”, charge you exorbitant charges and do a bad job; or they will trick you into letting them into your home so they can steal whatever they can pick up without you noticing. They use distraction in order to rifle your purse/credit or bank cards/jewellery then slip away without you having a clue (until it is too late) that they have taken anything.

Always ensure you keep yourself and your family safe both online and in your home – ensure your anti-virus program is up-to-date and that any updates are installed for all programs ..... We can talk more about this another time, or I can come to your group and give you a talk if you wish? But the one main thing to remember is, your front door is your barrier. If in any doubt – **KEEP THEM OUT** – by shutting and bolting the door.
