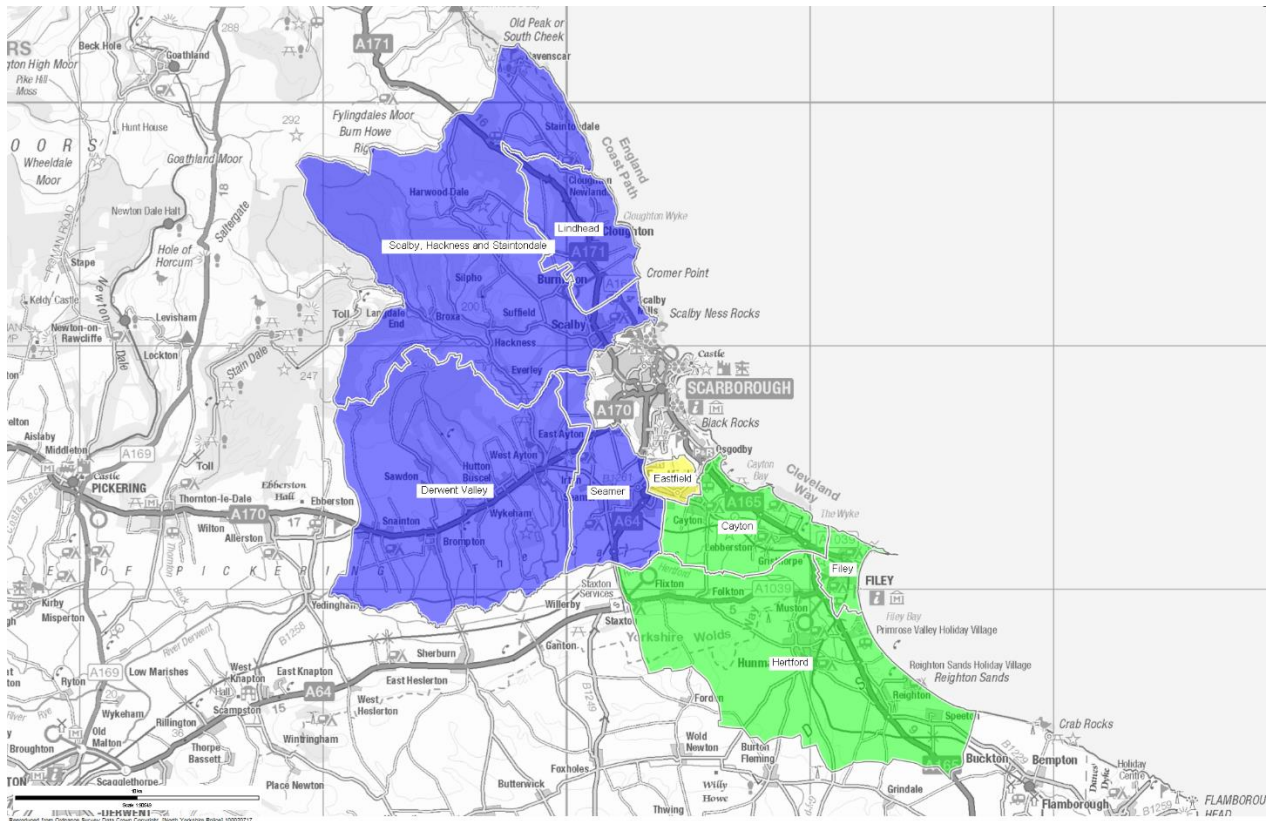

Which areas are covered from Filey and Eastfield Police Stations?

There were 102 incidents reported in your area during November. Incidents of note are as follows: -

- 06/11/2023 12:38 – A commercial burglary was reported to have occurred at Primrose Valley between 0030hrs and 0120hrs on 03/11/23. This is currently under investigation.
- 06/11/2023 12:38 – A caravan was reported to have been broken in to at Primrose Valley between 1030hrs and 1700hrs this same day. This is currently under investigation.
- 12/11/2023 18:15 – A passing motorist reported discovering a male laid in the middle of Filey Road in Hunmanby. Members of the public and off-duty paramedics stayed with the male until a family member arrived. The male had fallen from a push bike.

In addition to the crime stats, we also have access to data to show how many total incidents and crimes your local Officers have attended. The below figures are for all Parishes/Towns covered by Filey and Eastfield Police Station and includes ALL incidents and crimes.

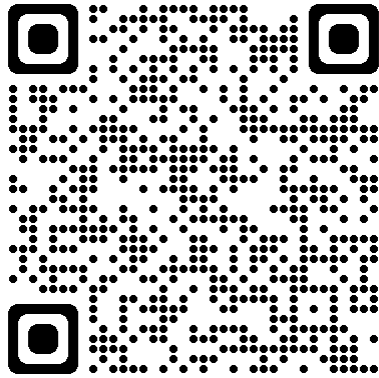
